
I am pleased to submit the 1974 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Glenn County as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

Agriculture continued to be the leading industry in the county setting a record gross value of \$103,142,000, an increase of \$9,879,000.

Values given in this report are gross receipts received by the growers and they in no way reflect the net income to the growers. As shown in the recapitulation, field crops, with rice leading the way, accounted for the major portion of increase, while livestock and poultry showed a decrease from 1973.

I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of all individuals who contributed to this report, and especially members of my staff who compiled the reports.
