	Director Christine Zoppi reported we are in best financial shape she has seen. Our budget has doubled, and we have added a great number of new staff. The last 24 months has been a rough ride as we re-align our process. Luckily, Community Action has not had any (covid-19) outbreaks in the office, and all staff is back in the office. Weatherization is working to resume services in all three counties. The Director listed new hires and promotions in CAD. We are in the process of securing a new workspace for the majority of the CAD team. Once that is signed, we will begin renovations and hope to have staff moved by late summer/early fall.  Non-profit organization update: stages of development— has its first contract employee, Jamie Umble, we will hire permanent employees in the non-profit. This non-profit could act as a TA to other non-profits in our area.

B. Glenn County	Board Member Phil Zabell discussed a repeater being installed in Glenn County to help with disaster related emergency communication. Director Christine Zoppi reported that the Board of Supervisors is working towards a Partnership for Health plan. Staff member Kathryn McDaniel reported on the No Place Like Home project in Glenn County. The county has partnered with a housing developer who is looking at a possible site in Orland; they've partnered with GC Behavioral Health for the supportive serviced provided for the project. Director Zoppi discussed ACES training in the near future.	
C. Trinity County	We have the ERAP grant to work with that program to pay for rent. Also been working with Southern Trinity with people affected by the August complex fire. We have supplied one gentleman with a trailer. A group of people has been meeting to look at the possibility to create a community development for low-income housing. Board Member Linda Wright complimented Liz Hamilton with DHHS for her effort to get the COVID vaccine out in Trinity County.
