This event will not accept tires, concrete, household hazardous waste, or medical waste. There will be an alternate event scheduled aside from Hamilton City, Willows, and Orland that we would like feedback as to another site that may be ideal to hold it. 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Williams mentioned Butte City as it is so far from the Transfer Station. Mrs. Richardson stated she would reach out to some of the Butte City organizations for volunteer assistance.

Mrs. Richardson reported the Board of Supervisors approved an Ordinance amending the Glenn County Code by adding Article 2.5 to Chapter 7.08 of Title 7 mandating organic waste disposal reduction. This was necessary to comply with SB 1383 and allows us the Grant funding. No discussion.

MATTER 8.4

WASTE MANAGEMENT MAPS/FEES - NE WILLOWS

Documents: **Proceedings:** None

Chair Carmon introduced the item. Mrs. Richardson stated that in our previous meeting citizen Dan Gupton brought forward his concern that Northeast Willows residents should possibly be charged the City rate versus the County unincorporated rate. Diana Ramirez, Waste Management, reported they went through the maps and boundaries of the agreement confirming the agreement is based on the City Limits and the boundaries of the County, not taking into effect the sphere of influence. Understanding this is a concern for the community and residents, Waste Management took the next step and performed a Geo Coding Audit with the County and both Cities verifying the locations. Out of approximately seventy-eight hundred (7800) locations verified, there were 100 found to be under the wrong rate structure, both overbilled and under-billed. Corrections have been made and notifications were sent out to those residents. Those that were over charged will be receiving a credit retroactive back to January 1, 2022. Those that will be receiving an increase will not be retroactively charged, they will just be charged correctly moving forward.

Member Williams asked if he could get copies of the new maps. Mrs. Ramirez stated yes and that the Cities of Willows and Orland Public Works offices have received these maps. Resident Dan Gupton, 370 Garden Street, Willows, spoke, inquiring the number of households in the Northeast Willows area. There was no response. Mr. Gupton shared one of the concerns of some of the residents was, they are not eligible for green waste nor are they able to technically put their green waste into the garbage, creating a catch 22. He inquired if it was possible to create an amendment taking into account those that are on City water, allowing them to pay the fee for green waste? Member Hoffman inquired why they haven't gone through the annexation process; this could be an easier and less expensive fix. Mrs. Ramirez explained that

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green waste is indeed allowed in the garbage receptacles and is processed as trash, not green waste, and accepted at the Transfer Station. Further details and discussion can be heard on the recorded link mentioned above.

The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) grants are primarily competitive grants made available by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) per Public Resources Code, Division 30, Part 7, Article 3.5, Section 47200 to help local governments establish or expand HHW collection programs.

Local Government Waste Tire Amnesty Grant

\$50,000 Awarded

Waste Tire Amnesty Grants include funds for date-specific events for the public and are not intended for the disposal of waste tires from waste tire generating businesses (PRC §42954(7)). Amnesty events 1) allow citizens to bring waste tires to convenient locations for proper management up to twice per month per location or 2) can consist of a coupon program that allows citizens to bring in waste tires on specified days.

Used Oil Payment Program (OPP)

\$10,000 Awarded

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers a program to provide opportunities for local governments/other eligible jurisdictions to receive payments for used oil and used oil filter collection/recycling programs.
