The WAC recommends that the Board of Supervisors not extend the well permit moratorium as it currently stands due to a lack of science and supporting data. The WAC and TAC members have held numerous meetings to discuss the groundwater conditions in Glenn County and what actions should be taken to guarantee sustainable groundwater conditions for all parties within the County. We have the following concerns and recommendations for the Glenn County Board of Supervisors:

- 1. The committee recommends the well permit moratorium not be extended due to a lack of science and supporting data to support such actions.
- 2. Groundwater conditions vary widely within the County and a one size fits all approach will not work for well construction criteria such as sealing wells at various levels. In some areas this will lead to the inability to find a usable source of groundwater.
- 3. Work on updating the current BMOs should be continued as planned. This process could be helped by consultant review and recommendations.
- 4. The WAC and TAC recommend that funding is made available by the County to fund a consulting firm to complete a county-wide water budget (water balance) and additional work to provide credible science to support groundwater management actions. This could eliminate the appearance of politics and emotion driving groundwater management decisions. Items of importance are listed below:
  - County-wide water budget (water balance)—approximately \$130,000 to be covered by a variety
    of sources including a portion covered under a grant administered by the County's Agricultural
    Department and additional funding from the County and other participating agencies. A water
    budget is fundamental in providing useful recommendations regarding well permitting and BMO
    revisions. Furthermore, a detailed water budget is also essential in moving the Sustainable
    Groundwater Management Act discussions forward, including the formation of Groundwater

The WAC has made significant progress regarding Basin Management Objective (BMO) revisions recommends that the Board of Supervisors not extend the well permit moratorium as it currently stands due to a lack of science and supporting data. The WAC and TAC members have held numerous meetings to discuss the groundwater conditions in Glenn County and what actions should be taken to guarantee sustainable groundwater conditions for all parties within the County. We have the following concerns and recommendations for the Glenn County Board of Supervisors:

- 1. The committee recommends the well permit moratorium not be extended due to a lack of science and supporting data to support such actions.
- Groundwater conditions vary widely within the County and a one size fits all approach will not work for well construction criteria such as sealing wells at various levels. In some areas this will lead to the inability to find a usable source of groundwater.
- 3. Work on updating the well permitting current BMOs should be continued as planned. This processcould be helped by consultant review and recommendations.
- 4. The WAC is requestingand TAC recommend that funding is made available by the County to fund a consulting firm to complete a county-wide water budget (water balance) and additional data analysis. work to provide credible science to support groundwater management actions. This could eliminate the appearance of politics and emotion driving groundwater management decisions. Items of importance are listed below:

Groundwater ordinance 1237, adopted August 7, 2012, included the Preliminary Plan for Groundwater Management(Preliminary Plan), developed by the consulting firm Wood Rodgers with guidance from the WAC and the County. Several tasks included in the Preliminary Plan have been completed, but several tasks remain. Additional resources are needed to complete the analysis requested by the Board. Please see the attached report and summary.

The WAC also developed a Report on Declining Groundwater Levels in Western Glenn County and an Action List that was approved by the Board of Supervisors in May 2014. Progress has been made toward completing these tasks, but ultimately, many of the items outlined require additional funds to complete. The report and Action List are attached.

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revisions. Furthermore, a detailed water budget is also essential in moving the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act discussions forward, including the formation of Groundwater Sustainability Agencies and Plans.—There is an opportunity to cost-share with other agencies; therefore we are requesting the County participate in the funding a third-party consultant to work on this project.
