What is Youth Employment Services (Y.E.S) and Who Participates?

- ◆ **Y.E.S.** is a Glenn County Program designed to help and benefit students, employers and the community.
- ◆ **Y.E.S.** provides work readiness, worksite training, employment and follow-up services.
- ◆ **Y.E.S.** is available to youth between the ages of *14-21 years old.

**Must be currently enrolled in a K-12 schools.*

What are the Requirements for Student's Participating in the Y.E.S. Program?

- ◆ Students must attend school regularly
- ◆ Students must attend:
 - *Foundational Career Course One
 - *Career Safe & Certified Course TwoPrior to work experience/volunteer training
- ◆ Students must attend: *Career Ready Course Three
- During work experience/volunteer training
- ◆ Students must pass ALL Courses with 80% or better.

What will Students Gain from the Y.E.S. Program?

- ◆ Career planning skills.
- ◆ Job search techniques.
- ◆ Character development.
- ◆ CTE/High School elective credits.
- ◆ Worksite training and transferable skills.
